Palestina: migrazioni internazionali e movimenti interni

- Importanti movimenti nella storia recente: 1946-48, 1967, 2023-24

1947 - 1949 «Nakba»:

750-900 mila persone sono costrette a lasciare le proprie case a seguito del primo **conflitto arabo-israeliano** e alla **creazione dello Stato di Israele** nel 1948

1967 conseguenze Guerra dei 6 giorni – occupazione militare israeliana:


300 mila palestinesi sono costretti a spostarsi all'interno del territorio palestinese occupato o a spostarsi all'estero. Di questi, 120 mila circa avevano già subito uno spostamento forzato nel periodo della «Nakba».

14.000 palestinesi vengono espulsi da Gerusalemme Est

2023-2024 Conflitto a Gaza

1.9 milioni di sfollati interni (circa il 90% della popolazione della Striscia di Gaza)

I movimenti forzati all'interno della Striscia di Gaza





Hospital Evacuation Orders Mapping as of 16th October 2023


1.1 million people in North Gaza and Gaza governorates (north of Wadi Gaza) were ordered by Israeli forces to evacuate. Mass displacement of people poses major public health concerns including related to inadequate food, water, and shelter, and immediate risk of communicable disease outbreaks that would disproportionately impact the most vulnerable groups such as neonates, children, immune-compromised people, the elderly, and pregnant women. Displacement has also resulted in the crowding of some hospitals as people seek safety.

Hospitals in northern Gaza have also been ordered to evacuate by the Israeli forces. The order is applicable to 23 hospitals in Gaza and North Gaza governorates, affecting over 2000 patients. There is no capacity for hospitals in the south to receive such vast numbers of patients. Such movement would pose an immediate threat to the lives of patients.

On 15 October, Kuwaiti Hospital in Rafah was also ordered to evacuate.




Evacuation Orders in Gaza Since the Beginning of the War

“The General Assembly’s subsequent Resolution 194 of December 1948 stating that those ‘refugees wishing to return to their homes and live in peace with their neighbours should be permitted to do so at the earliest practicable date, and that compensation should be paid for the property of those choosing not to return and for loss or damage to property,’ was never implemented.


The State of the World’s Refugees 2006, UNHCR Chapter 5

UNRWA definisce “rifugiato palestinese” *una persona “il cui normale luogo di residenza è stata la Palestina tra il giugno 1946 e maggio 1948, che ha perso sia l’abitazione che i mezzi di sussistenza a causa della guerra arabo-israeliana del 1948”*

I servizi principali dell’Agenzia, nata nel 1950, comprendono l’istruzione, l’assistenza sanitaria, i servizi sociali, le infrastrutture e il miglioramento dei campi.

Figure 1. Number of Palestinian Refugees, 1952-2022*








DA SAPERE




